Table SDC – **Summary of health-related minigrant programs with published process or outcome evaluations.** Papers and programs were identified with Google Scholar searches on *minigrant health* and *microgrant health*. Of 79 peer-reviewed English-language papers thus identified, 35 papers discussed at least two of three aspects of 28 health-related minigrant programs: award process, program goals, and/or minigrant outcomes. The 28 programs are summarized here with the LGMP added for ease of reference. (In this table, EBP stands for evidence-based program).
